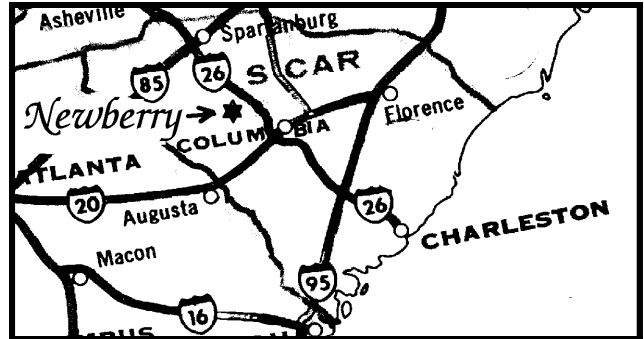
Out-of-Towner Information

To Get to Newberry

Newberry is 1.5 miles from exit 74 of I26 (I26 at state route 34). It is 40 miles NW of Columbia, SC along Interstate 26. Major airlines serve the Columbia airport.

The Area

Newberry has been listed as one of the 100 best small towns in the U. S. It is home to Newberry College and has a large number of beautiful Victorian and earlier homes. In downtown, they have restored the old Opera House and it has become an attraction in itself. We're meeting in the Newberry Community Hall, which is the restored court house that was built in 1852 and used as a courthouse until the current one was built. It has an elevator for those who might have difficulty with the steps.

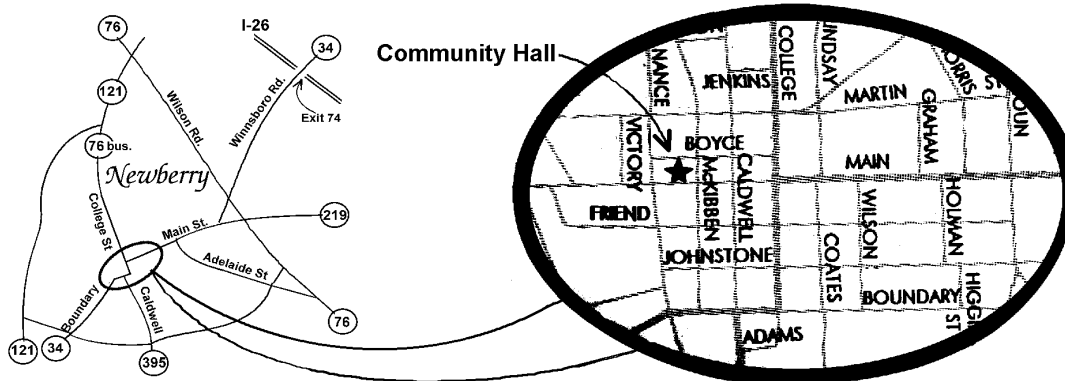
